

Zoom meeting TV display for Clubhouse

Windows 11: Per Microsoft Instructions

Very Important:

You also must have **Private Network Sharing** on, under **Settings -> Network & internet -> Advanced network settings**, before you attempt to connect to the TV. I recommend setting **Advanced sharing settings** to 'connect automatically'.

TV Display:

- Turn the TV on, connect your laptop to the clubhouse internet, ID & PW on inside door of cabinet by kitchen.
- On your laptop go to **Settings -> System -> Display -> Multiple Displays -> Connect to a wireless display -> Connect**.
- A little window named '**Cast**' will pop up and start searching for '**Available displays**', then pause, because it takes a moment for your laptop to find the TV.
- When you see the name of the TV appear in the '**Cast**' window select it.
- Return to the TV and select '**Allow**' to display your laptop screen.
- Give it a few moments to connect and your Zoom meeting will now appear on the TV.

Before you do this, the **OWL** must be powered up and plugged in to your laptop (and allowed to warm up for a few minutes), open the **Owl App**, wait for the **Owl eyes** to light up. Audio volume control is around the bottom of the **Owl** with **+/-** buttons.

The Audio controls on your laptop must be turned up, also.

Press **Windows Start key + K** to return to TV display if lost.

Notes:

Of course, this above procedure assumes the Wi-Fi router/modem is powered on.

This can easily be setup and tested at home if you have a Smart TV, wirelessly connected to the internet.

Remember: the clubhouse, just like your home, is a private **Secured** Wi-Fi network.
